James Mangerere is the President of the Africa Mediation Association (AMA). He is a Distinguished Fellow of the International Academy of Mediators (IAM), President of the Mediation Training Institute, and a Senior Advocate of the High Court of Kenya.

Guest Speakers:

Claudia Marile Kuck

After having completed her law degree at Bucerius Law School Hamburg, Germany, that included a semester abroad at Washington University in the U.S., Ms. Kuck is currently finalizing her PhD thesis on hybrid dispute resolution mechanisms at the European University Viadrina in Frankfurt/Oder. For her research, she spent several months at Singapore Management University. Beside her PhD, Ms. Kuck is an IMI-qualified mediator and working as a lecturer for mediation at European University Viadrina and at Hochschule Fresenius in Hamburg. While studying, She participated in the ICC Mediation Competition Where her team reached the semi-finals. She coached several Bucerius team afterwards. Furthermore, she is part of the founding team and has continuously being involve in the organization of the Bucerius Mediation Competition - an international learning event for student. Since 2022, Ms. Kuck is Co-Director of the Consensual Dispute Resolution Competition Vienna held under the auspices of the International Bar Association and the Vienna International Arbitration Centre.

David Kabwa is currently a student at the University of Pretoria pursuing a Master's Degree in Diplomatic Studies under the Centre For Mediation in Africa. He is currently serving as the Country Ambassador for the South Africa to the UNITE 2030 Initiative. Moreover, he is an inaugural member of the African Union Youth For Transitional Justice (AY4TJ) continental platform where he was trained as a youth expert in African Union Transitional Justice Policy (AUTJP) by the AU Department for Political Affairs, Peace and Security. He has also recently been appointed to the board member of the Africa Africa Entrepreneurship and Investment Forum (AAEIF). In 2019, he was elected as the Prime Minister for the Commonwealth Youth Parliament. He was the first African elected to this position where he would oversee the legislative affairs of young people across 54 countries. He also served for two consecutive term as the Student Representative Council President of the University of Pretoria as an independent where he would oversee 60,000 students across 7 campuses. He was the first President to complete term as an independent. Mr Kabwa has also served as the Chairperson of Second Commission in the Gauteng Youth Sector Parliament. He has also been inducted into the Mail & Guardian Top 200 Youth South Africans and the Junior Chamber International Top 10 Outstanding Young Persons In South Africa in the category of politics. In 2021, he was an inaugural recipient of the Hope Givers Foundation in Association with Brand South Africa and the National Lotteries Commission Raising Legends Award in the category Academia, Advocacy and Leadership for work done to combat Gender-Based Violence through the Boy-Child Initiative.

He had previously worked for the UN in New York and Nigeria.
